Discuss the nature of homework across the school (always a hard one as some parents want more and some want less!) 3. Continue and where necessary clarify with parents where pupils are in relation to 'Age Related Outcomes'. 4. Present to parents at the start of the year the curriculum related to maths, English and other areas

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Erect a notice board at the front of school that parents can refer to 2. Look towards having class parents meeting at the start of each academic year 3. Ensure all dates are entered on the school newsletter diary

Actions to be implemented –

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily mile to promote health • Pastoral care the school offers to pupils and parents • Gates being locked provides security • Children feel safe • Outdoor learning including forest school • Children are happy 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • More secure fencing • Lighting of the school building when it is dark – could be brighter • Control of traffic outside of school around pick up time • Less sugary products being brought in • Reflect on first aid procedures • Address any low level bullying
Actions to be implemented –	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Lighting is now fixed 2. Some fencing has been fixed and more is scheduled to be fixed 3. Work with police on traffic control / patrols and advice to parents to not park on double yellow lines 4. Check school lunch policy 5. Check and where necessary revise first aid policy 6. Introduction of new school behaviour policy
